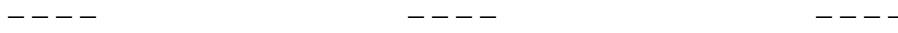

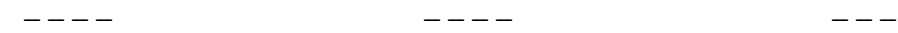

Community of Christ in Hebrews” by Melissa Bane Sevier received honorable mention by the Associated Church Press, the oldest and largest Christian press in North America.

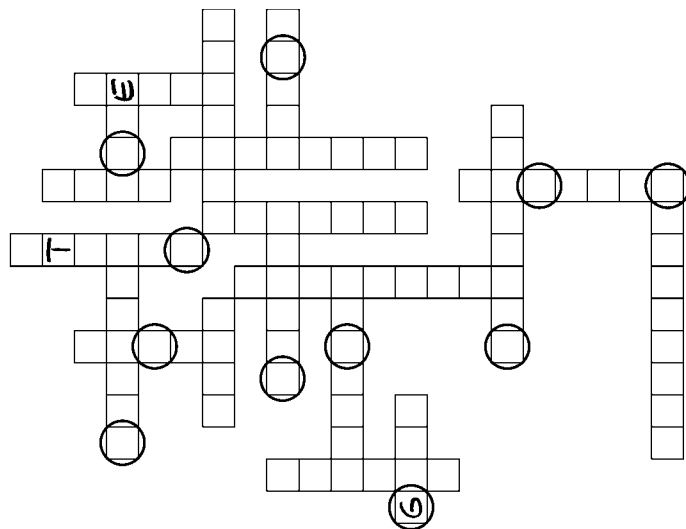
